This is my neighbourhood – Sherwood, Nolan Hill and Kincora

Over the last year, residents of Sherwood, Nolan Hill and Kincora identified ways to help their neighbourhood become an even better place to live, work and play.

Residents outlined what was important to them, focusing on the themes of people, places, programs and possibilities. These discussions led to the development of their community vision: *A diverse landscape, working together to create an active, safe and friendly neighbourhood.*

The City then worked with residents to identify projects that would support the vision and be possible in their neighbourhood. Residents prioritized the projects and City Administration ensured they could be implemented.

The following is a summary of programs, services and/or small-scale infrastructure improvements that The City of Calgary will implement in partnership with residents of Sherwood, Nolan Hill and Kincora:

Existing City Programs and Services in your Neighbourhood

The following is an overview of your neighbourhood's requested programs, services and/or small-scale improvement projects which are already being delivered by The City:

Requested Project	Project Details
Bylaw Presence	<p>The City of Calgary employs enforcement officers and peace officers whose primary responsibility is to ensure that Calgary is a place where pets, their owners and their neighbours can live together in harmony.</p> <p>They enforce a variety of bylaws including the <u>Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw</u> & <u>Community Standards Bylaw</u>. The do this by partnering with Citizens and communities to resolve issues through education and enforcement,</p>

	investigating complaints and reunite lost pets with their owners.
Bus Services	Four times a year, Calgary Transit looks at their bus routes and schedules in order to identify ways to improve service. View the most recent Spring Service Changes .
Green Space Maintenance	The City of Calgary maintains over 8,000 hectares of parkland and natural areas, working year round to develop and sustain our green spaces. Grass mowing at public parks is targeted for every two weeks. Playfields are mowed weekly. To request park maintenance, please call 311 .
Off-Leash Areas	Calgary has 150 public off-leash areas . The City of Calgary is constantly working to increase and improve off-leash areas in parks for citizens and their dogs to play. The Off-Leash Area Management Plan was developed to provide consistent, city-wide guidelines for off-leash areas. Before additional areas and site changes can be implemented, public consultation needs to occur.
Pathways	The City has an annual plan that outlines pathway improvements scheduled for 2016.
Playgrounds	The City will meet with residents and the community association to discuss options to repair and/or upgrade the neighbourhood playgrounds . If you have any questions or safety concerns about the playgrounds in your neighbourhood, please contact 311 .
Recreation Facilities	Located at 11300 Rocky Ridge Road N.W., the Rocky Ridge Recreation Facility will provide a blend of leisure, sport, arts, cultural and recreational amenities when opens in 2017.
Residential Speeding	Speed Limit Observations Warning System (SLOWS) trailers are available to be requested for areas where speeding is a concern.
ReTree Community Program	The ReTree Community Program is scheduled to take place in Kincora in 2016.
Sidewalk Repairs	From mid-March to mid-October, sidewalk repairs occur on the streets, curbs, gutters, lanes and sidewalks of Calgary. To learn more about this work, or to report a damaged sidewalk, visit Calgary.ca/concrete .

Sound Walls	The City of Calgary is committed to reducing the impact of such noise in residential areas. Please contact us if you have a noise barrier request or would like modifications made to an existing noise barrier.
Speeding Concerns	The Calgary Police Service requests your assistance in identifying speeding concerns in the community. Complete a traffic service request to report speeding and specific locations of concern. All such requests will be provided to the local officers to manage.
Spring Street Cleaning	Spring street cleaning is an annual City program that begins in April and runs until the end of June.
Storm Drains	Rain water and melting snow are drawn into catch basins or storm drains located on the edge of the sidewalk and flow into our storm systems. To help keep sidewalks and roads safe, you can help in prevent pooling by clearing away ice, snow and debris, creating a pathway for melting snow to drain. Newer communities have inlet control devices that control water drainage in order to not overflow the system. Do not attempt to remove ice or clean a submerged catch basin. If you have any questions, concerns or if pooling lasts please call 311 .
Traffic Calming	The process for traffic management measures such as speed bumps, speed tables, curb extensions, raised medians and traffic circles are outlined in The City's Traffic Calming Policy . Please note that this process takes a significant amount of time and requires specific information regarding the concerns at the location. Due to the lack of information at this time, we are unable to move forward with any concerns shared during engagement. We encourage residents to review The City's traffic calming measures or contact 311 to submit a request for consideration.
Traffic Education	Calgary Police Service's Traffic Education Unit offers a variety of safety and education services in partnership with community organizations, schools and other agencies or groups. For information, contact us at 403-567-4000.

Status of Other Requested Improvement Projects

The following is a list of requested programs, services and/or small-scale improvement projects that we heard from you as part of our This is my neighbourhood engagement process. We explored the possibility of developing each project, but unfortunately, it was not possible for The City to proceed due to a variety of logistical and resource constraints.

Requested Projects	Project Details
Crosswalks	A total of four local crosswalk intersections were tested by The City in 2015. The test results showed that the locations did not meet The City's minimum requirements for a crosswalk to be installed.
Emerging Artist Project	<p>This project had several factors to consider such as location and timelines. As such, this will continue to be pursued by the Sherwood Community Garden Group, outside of the This is my neighbourhood program.</p> <p>If you are interested in this project or community garden, please contact the Sherwood Community Association.</p>
Residential Speed Limits	Residential speed limits in Calgary are 50 km/hr unless otherwise posted. At this time, The City is not proceeding with implementation of blanket speed reductions on residential roadways. This includes pilot projects on a community specific basis.

Traffic Signals

A total of two local intersections were tested for [traffic signals](#) by The City in 2015. The [test results](#) showed that the intersections did not meet The City's requirements for traffic signals to be installed.
