



## This is my neighbourhood – Taradale

Over the last year, residents of Taradale identified ways to help their neighbourhood become an even better place to live, work and play.

Residents outlined what was important to them, focusing on the themes of people, places, programs and possibilities. These discussions led to the development of Taradale's community vision: *A dynamic community with a safe, beautiful environment.*

The City then worked with residents to identify projects that would support the vision and be possible in their neighbourhood. Residents prioritized the projects and City Administration ensured they could be implemented.

The following is a summary of programs, services and/or small-scale infrastructure improvements that The City of Calgary will implement in partnership with residents of Taradale:

### Existing City Programs and Services in your Neighbourhood

The following is an overview of your neighbourhood's requested programs, services and/or small-scale improvement projects which are already being delivered - or in the process of being developed - by The City:

Request Project	Project Details
Children and Youth Programs	There are <a href="#">Calgary AfterSchool</a> programs taking place in Taradale at Ted Harrison and the Taradale Co-op from September 2015 to May 2016. For more information and to learn how to register, call <a href="#">311</a> .
Extended Driveways	Residents who wish to <a href="#">extend their driveway</a> are encouraged to start a Subdivision Development Appeals process. The current bylaws are under assessment due to resident feedback. To stay informed, we encourage you to contact your <a href="#">Ward Office</a> .
Pathways	The City has an <a href="#">annual plan</a> that outlines <a href="#">pathway</a> improvements scheduled for 2016.

Public Transit to SAIT	Calgary Transit's <a href="#">North Crosstown BRT Project</a> is currently in development and construction is scheduled to begin in August 2016.
Sport Fields	<a href="#">Sport fields</a> are highly valued assets in the city. An initial <a href="#">Sport Field Strategy</a> review was undertaken in 2015 with the goal of developing recommendations in 2016.
Street Signs	New street signs were installed in 2015 for pedestrian crossings and playgrounds.
Waste and Recycling Education	The City studied the recycling habits of the neighbourhood in 2015. The results from that study are currently being analyzed to determine which <a href="#">education programs</a> are best suited for the residents.
Water Parks	<a href="#">Prairie Winds Park</a> is a regional park located in Calgary's Westwinds community. The park is currently entering <a href="#">redevelopment with the help of public input</a> .

Communications Hub	The <a href="#">Taradale Community Association</a> is currently leading this initiative. The goal of the Hub is to increase communication amongst residents through a variety of online and print mediums.

Community Events	The <a href="#">Taradale Community Association</a> hosts several community events throughout the year.

Community Signage and Beautification	<p>After assessing the request it was determined that the additional resources required to complete such a project were not within the allowable small-scale infrastructure project parameters outlined in the This is my neighbourhood program.</p> <p>This project is still possible but requires a Community Champion to spearhead community support and develop a plan for the sign's long-term care and maintenance.</p>

Community Association Building	The <a href="#">Taradale Community Association</a> , in partnership with the Martindale and Saddle Ridge Community Associations, previously agreed to use the designated land for the development of the Genesis Centre.
Community Leadership Program	<p>The <a href="#">Federation of Calgary Communities</a> provides many opportunities for residents and community association members to learn how they can take a leadership role in their neighbourhood.</p> <p>The <a href="#">Taradale Community Association's</a> board of directors is also currently assessing its own skills and determining specific training options that they will seek out.</p>
ESL programs	<a href="#">1000 Voices</a> and the <a href="#">Calgary Public Library</a> at the <a href="#">Genesis Centre</a> offer a variety of programs to assist new Canadians in improving the English language.

Requested Project	Project Details
Crosswalks	A total of nine local <a href="#">crosswalk</a> locations were tested by The City in 2015. The <a href="#">test results</a> showed that the locations did not meet The City's minimum requirements for a crosswalk to be installed.
