



This is my neighbourhood – Dover

Over the last year, residents of Dover identified ways to help their neighbourhood become an even better place to live, work and play.

Residents outlined what was important to them, focusing on the themes of people, places, programs and possibilities. These discussions led to the development of Dover's community vision: *A safe, clean, diverse and accepting neighbourhood. We strive to make our family-friendly neighbourhood one we can be even more proud of by looking out for each other, involving our youth, and supporting local businesses. We know and are connected to our neighbours.*

The City then worked with residents to identify projects that would support the vision and be possible in their neighbourhood. Residents prioritized the projects and City Administration ensured they could be implemented.

The following is a summary of programs, services and/or small-scale infrastructure improvements that The City of Calgary will implement in partnership with residents of Dover:

Existing City Programs and Services in your Neighbourhood

The following is an overview of your neighbourhood's requested programs, services and/or small-scale improvement projects which are already being delivered by The City:

Requested Projects	Project Details
Animal Care	The City of Calgary offers a No Cost Spay and Neuter Program for low income Calgarians.
Fit Park Sessions	The City is offering free classes on June 9 and 21 that will instruct residents on how to use the equipment in the fit park located behind the Greater Forest Lawn 55+ Society (3425 - 26 Ave. S.E.).
LED Lighting	The City's LED Street Lighting Program is scheduled to take place in communities across Calgary over four years (2015-18). This program replaced lighting through Dover in 2015.
I Love Soccer Program	The City, in partnership with Jumpstart , provides the I Love Soccer indoor program for kids with little or no experience. The goal of the program is to have fun and learn basic soccer skills.
Off-Leash Enforcement	<p>The Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw enables The City of Calgary to work with residents to ensure that cats, dogs, their owners and neighbours live together safe and harmoniously.</p> <p>All areas in Calgary are on-leash except for off-leash areas that are designated by signs. To report any concerns or incidents, please file a complaint or call 311.</p>
Pathway Improvements	The City has an annual plan that outlines pathway improvements scheduled for 2016.
ReTree YYC Community Program	<p>As part of the ReTree Community Program, Dover had elm pruning, tree planting and the program Neighbourwoods in 2015. Ongoing service request work will continue throughout the year.</p> <p>If you see a tree concern, please call 311.</p>
Sidewalk Repairs	From mid-March to mid-October, sidewalk repairs occur on the streets, curbs, gutters, lanes and sidewalks of Calgary.

Speeding Concerns	<p>The Calgary Police Service requests your assistance in identifying speeding concerns in the community.</p> <p>Complete a traffic service request to report speeding and specific locations of concern. All such requests will be provided to the local officers to manage.</p>
Street Signs	New street signs were installed in 2015 for street parking and playgrounds.
Traffic Calming	<p>The process for traffic management measures such as speed bumps, speed tables, curb extensions, raised medians and traffic circles are outlined in The City's Traffic Calming Policy.</p> <p>Please note that this process takes a significant amount of time and requires specific information regarding the concerns at the location.</p> <p>Due to the lack of information at this time, we are unable to move forward with any concerns shared during engagement. We encourage residents to review The City's traffic calming measures or contact 311 to submit a request for consideration.</p>
Wheelchair Ramps	Several wheelchair ramps were installed in Dover in 2015.

Community Garden	A group of volunteers have worked to construct and maintain the Twin Views Communal Garden located at 3425 - 26 Ave. S.E.

Requested Project	Project Details
After School Programming	There are several after school programs available in and around Dover. This includes Calgary AfterSchool at St. Damien School, in partnership with the Calgary Bridge Foundation and The City of Calgary; out of school care at the Dover Community Centre , the Bob Bahan Aquatic and Fitness Centre , programming at the Forest Lawn Boys & Girls Club and Starbright and Odyssey youth programs at Ian Bazalgette School.
Back Alley Lighting	Residents interested in back alley lighting options are asked to contact Enmax for more information.
Family Programs and Services	The greater Dover area is home to many agencies that provide a variety of programs and services for families. This includes Patch with Hull Child and Family Services , Forest Lawn Boys & Girls Club and programs with the YMCA .

Sport Programming	<p>There are many different organizations supporting sport at all levels throughout Calgary. To learn more, we encourage you to connect with Sport Calgary, a volunteer non-profit society who represents and advocates for amateur sport in Calgary.</p> <p>They host sport discovery sessions, such as All Sport One Day on June 18.</p>
Recreation Facilities	The regional recreational facilities serving the local area include the Bob Bahan Aquatic and Fitness Centre , the Ernie Starr Arena , Forest Lawn Athletic Park and the Valleyview Regional Park .
Retail Stores	<p>The City does not have any policies or procedures in place to formally request - or block - the addition of a specific type of retail store.</p> <p>For more information on your neighbourhood's long-term planning and development, visit the Dover Land Use Study.</p>

Status of Other Requested Improvement Projects

The following is a list of requested programs, services and/or small-scale improvement projects that we heard from you as part of our This is my neighbourhood engagement process. We explored the possibility of developing each project, but unfortunately, it was not possible for The City to proceed due to a variety of logistical and resource constraints.

Requested Projects	Project Details
Crosswalks	A total of five local crosswalk intersections were tested by The City in 2015. The test results showed that the locations did not meet The City's minimum requirements for a crosswalk to be installed.
Flower Beds	<p>After assessing this project with community stakeholders, it was determined that a sustainability plan was not possible to meet the project's requirements.</p> <p>If you, or a group of residents, are interested in supporting this project and its year-round sustainability, please contact your local neighbourhood partnership coordinator Iris Li at iris.li@calgary.ca. General Education on Community Standards	<p>The Community Standards Bylaw helps us create healthy, safe and vibrant communities by addressing nuisances, such as untidy properties.</p> <p>This bylaw contains regulations for property owners and for property maintenance. Citizens can provide Calgary Community Standards with information regarding bylaw violations.</p> <p>At this time, this bylaw is going through an extensive review and as such general education is not possible. We invite all citizens to participate in our current programs for prevention and public awareness.</p>
I Love Skating Program	<p>After further exploring the possibility of this program, we learned that ice time was unavailable in the region to facilitate.</p> <p>For those interesting in learning to skate, we encourage you to look to The City of Calgary's Skating & Hockey Recreation Program Guide.</p>
Pop Up Park	<p>Following the This is my neighbourhood prioritization process in November 2015, it was determined that there was not a need or significant interest in a pop up park as Dover is well serviced with its current parks and green spaces, including the Valleyview Regional Park.</p>
Residential Speed Limits	<p>Residential speed limits in Calgary are 50 km/hr unless otherwise posted. At this time, The City is not proceeding with implementation of blanket speed reductions on residential roadways. This includes pilot projects on a community specific basis.</p>
